FINAL AWARD


An interlocutory order was entered herein on March 17, 1971, 25 Ind. Cl. Comm. 1, 20, awarding the plaintiffs the sum of \$200,560.00, less offsets "hereinafter determined to be properly deductible", as additional compensation for land ceded by the plaintiffs under the Treaty of February 18, 1833, 7 Stat. 420.


On March 26, 1973, a hearing was had before the Commission to determine the offsets, if any, allowable under the Indian Claims Commission Act. The defendant presented all legal offset claims resulting from the Treaty of August 30, 1833, 7 Stat. 359, and the Treaty of February 18, 1833, in this docket, whereupon the parties agreed and stipulated in open hearing before the Commission that \$17,950.00 claimed as legal offsets was in fact paid by the defendant and receipt thereof acknowledged by the plaintiffs and that any and all further and additional claims for both legal and gratuitous offsets in this docket and Docket 305 were withdrawn by the defendant.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the agreement of the parties that \$17,950.00 paid by the defendant to the plaintiff under the Treaty of February 18, 1833, is additional compensation for land ceded by the plaintiff in the Treaty of August 30, 1831, and that all further and additional claims for legal and gratuitous offsets in Docket 304 and Docket 305 be withdrawn, is approved.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that as a final award the plaintiffs have and recover from the defendant the sum of \$182,610.00 in full satisfaction of all claims presented in Docket 304.
