## FINAL AWARD

UPON JOINT MOTION FOR ENTRY OF FINAL JUDGMENT filed by the parties herein on November 19, 1973, pursuant to a Stipulation for Entry of Final Judgment filed with said motion, and, further, upon the agreement between the parties that no review would be sought or appeal taken from said final judgment, the Commission considered the evidence presented.

THE COMMISSION, having this date entered findings of fact, which are made part of this order, concludes as a matter of law that the proposed settlement of the plaintiffs' claims is equitable and just to both parties and that final judgment should be entered in accordance with the stipulation.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Stipulation for Entry of Final Judgment is hereby accepted, that the Plaintiffs' Motion for Waiver of Hearing on Compromise Settlement is Hereby Granted, that the Joint Motion for Entry of Final Judgment is hereby granted, and that the plaintiffs, for an on behalf of the Angoon Tribe, shall have and recover in Docket

278-B from the defendant the sum of ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000.00), subject to the terms and provisions set forth in the Stipulation for Entry of Final Judgment.
