ORDER SEPARATING CONSOLIDATED ACCOUNTING CLAIMS IN DOCKETS
69, 299 AND 353 FROM REMAINING CLAIMS IN DOCKET 69

Plaintiff's petition in Docket 69 asserted eight claims. Plaintiff's seventh claim in Docket 69 asked for an accounting report, as did plaintiff's claims in Dockets 299 and 353. Defendant filed a single general accounting office report in response to the accounting claims in all three dockets, and we consolidated the dockets. 31 Ind. Cl. Comm. 40 (1973). The remaining claims in Docket 69 have no relation to the aforementioned accounting claims, wherefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that in all future proceedings, the consolidated accounting claims in Dockets 69, 299 and 353 hereby are separated from the remaining other claims in Docket 69.


