INTERLOCUTORY ORDER

Upon the findings of fact and opinion filed herein, which are hereby made a part of the order, the Commission concludes as a matter of law that:

1. Finding of Fact 10 previously entered herein, 28 Ind. Cl. Comm. 237, 249, is erroneous and should be vacated.
2. The United States had actual notice of both the treaties of July 27, 1795, and May 30, 1807.
3. A representative of the United States was in attendance at the treaty of May 30, 1807.


IT IS ORDERED that Finding of Fact 10 previously entered herein, supra, be, and the same is hereby, vacated.


This docket will proceed to a determination of the extent of the defendant's liability to the plaintiff under the 1795 and 1807 treaties.
