FINAL AWARD


UPON JOINT MOTION FOR ENTRY OF FINAL JUDGMENT by the parties herein on October 29, 1975, pursuant to a stipulation for compromise settlement and entry of final judgment filed with said motion, the Commission considered the evidence presented, both oral and written, at a hearing held on November 4, 1975.

THE COMMISSION, having entered findings of fact, which are hereby made a part of this order, concludes as a matter of law that the proposed settlement of the plaintiffs' claims is equitable and just to both parties and that final judgment should be entered in accordance with the stipulation.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the stipulation for compromise settlement and entry of final judgment is hereby accepted, that the joint motion for entry of final judgment is hereby granted, and that the plaintiffs, the Confederated Tribes of the Goshute Reservation suing on its own behalf and on behalf of the Goshute Tribe, and the Goshute Tribe or Identifiable Group, Represented by the Confederated Tribes of the Goshute Reservation, shall have and recover from the defendant the sum of seven million, three hundred thousand dollars


(\$7,300,000), subject to the terms and provisions set forth in the stipulation for compromise settlement and entry of final judgment.
