FINAL AWARD

Upon joint motion for entry of final judgment filed by the parties herein on January 19, 1977, pursuant to a stipulation for entry of final judgment filed with said motion, the Commission considered the evidence presented, both oral and written, at a hearing held on February 3, 1977.

The Commission, having this date entered findings of fact which are hereby made part of this order, concludes as a matter of law that the proposed settlement of plaintiff's claim is equitable and just to all parties and that final judgment should be entered in accordance with the stipulation.

It is therefore ordered that the stipulation for entry of final judgment is hereby accepted, that the joint motion for entry of final judgment is hereby granted, and that plaintiff in Docket 73-A shall, in full settlement of all claims in this docket, have and recover from defendant, the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00), subject to the terms and provisions set forth in the stipulation for entry of final judgment.
