ORDER

UPON the findings of fact and opinion this day filed herein, which are hereby made a part of this order, the Commission concludes that the evidence is insufficient for a determination to be made ascertaining the actual numbers of Tetons and Yanktons using and occupying the Sioux-Fort Laramie lands.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the order previously entered by this Commission on December 2, 1970, is reentered. That portion of the order pertaining to the issue now confronting the Commission is as follows:

- 1) The Yankton division of Sioux held an undivided 17 percent interest in the land reserved to the "Sioux or Dahcotah Nation" by the Treaty of Fort Laramie of 1851.
- 2) The Teton division of Sioux held an undivided 83 percent interest in the land reserved to the "Sioux or Dahcotah Nation" by the Treaty of Fort Laramie.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the consolidation of Dockets 74 and 332-C is hereby dissolved.


