ORDER CERTIFYING AND TRANSFERRING CASE TO THE UNITED STATES COURT OF CLAIMS

Pursuant to the pre-trial conference held before Chairman Jerome K. Kuykendall in the above-captioned docket on August 4, 1977, at which time counsel for the defendant stated that defendant will require ten to twelve months to prepare for the valuation trial herein ordered by the Court of Claims upon remand of this case to the Commission on April 14, 1977, 209 Ct. Cl. 433, the Commission has concluded that because of the length of time defendant will require to prepare for trial, a decision by the Commission on valuation cannot be entered before September 30, 1978.


THEREFORE, pursuant to Public Law 94-465, approved October 8, 1976 (90 Stat. 1990), the Indian Claims Commission concludes that it cannot completely adjudicate Docket 182-A by September 30, 1978, and accordingly

HEREBY ORDERS that said case be, and the same hereby is, certified to the United States Court of Claims under the terms of the above-cited statute and is hereby transferred to that court, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Commission shall place a copy of this order and copies of all docket book entries in this case in the file of Docket 182-A, and shall file a copy of this order with the Clerk of the United States Court of Claims.
