

ADDITIONAL FINAL AWARD

By the order approving compromise settlement made and entered herein on September 8, 1977, it was provided, among other things, that if the Court of Claims should affirm without qualification the decision of this Commission in Prairie Band of Pottawatomi v. United States, Appeal No. 6-76, an additional award should be entered ~~herein~~ in favor of the plaintiffs in the amount of \$255,273. It was further provided in the final award made and entered herein on September 14, 1977, that plaintiffs' claim for said \$255,273 should not be disposed of thereby. The Court of Claims having affirmed said Appeal No. 6-76, without qualification, on October 19, 1977, the plaintiffs having moved for entry of the aforesaid additional award, and the time allowed by the rules of this Commission for the defendant to respond to plaintiffs' motion now having expired without the defendant having so responded,

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the plaintiffs shall have and recover from the defendant on behalf of the Sisseton-Wahpeton Bands who entered into the agreement of September 20, 1872, as modified and accepted by the United States and the Bands, the sum of two hundred and fifty-five thousand two hundred and seventy-three dollars (\$255,273) in addition to the \$13,129,661 awarded to them by the final award of September 14, 1977.
