FINAL AWARD

UPON JOINT MOTION FOR ENTRY OF FINAL JUDGMENT filed by the parties herein on March 29, 1978, pursuant to a stipulation for entry of final judgment filed with said motion, the Commission considered the evidence presented, both oral and written, at a hearing called for that purpose on April 8, 1978.

THE COMMISSION, having this day entered findings of fact, which are hereby made part of this order, concludes as a matter of law that the proposed settlement of the plaintiffs' claim is equitable and just to both parties and that final judgment should be entered in accordance with the stipulation.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the stipulation for entry of final judgment is hereby accepted, that the joint motion for entry of final judgment is hereby granted, and that the plaintiffs shall have and recover from the defendant the sum of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000.00) subject to the terms and provisions set forth in the stipulation for entry of final judgment.
