#### ADDITIONAL FINDINGS OF FACT

The Commission makes the following findings of fact which are supplemental to the findings numbered 1-24, entered herein at 26 Ind. Cl. Comm. 410, 456 (1971), and the findings numbered 25-47, entered herein at 40 Ind. Cl. Comm. 175, 196 (1977).

48. Payments on the Claim. The defendant has asked the Commission to deduct from the interlocutory award herein \$690,844.66 in consideration payments that were made pursuant to the provisions of the 1832 Treaty. To substantiate its offset claims the defendant has introduced into evidence a detailed 1964 General Accounting Office report along with supporting vouchers, schedules and related documentary material. The Commission has carefully considered each of the defendant's offset claims as well as the plaintiffs' specific objections thereto. For the reasons stated in our opinion we have concluded from the record as follows:
